Videos

The videos of the liberations were originally put in place to see how many birds were getting out of the transporters before the official liberation and to date no birds have been see getting out before the federation liberation time.

The ISRF were the first federation in Ireland to have live liberations on face book this brought the ISRF liberations on to the phones and computers of pigeon fanciers and non-fanciers around the world. Some fanciers felt this a step in the right direction and others felt it was not.

With the best will in the world some liberations don't go as planned and some fanciers have decided to use these video's to criticise the ISRF committee members and the conveyers on social media sites.

Results

The WEEKLY and OPEN results were put up on the **ISRF and PigeonLink** web sites and also given out every week at the transporters on a weekly bases.

The ISRF weekly running averages and averages were displayed this year on the ISRF site.

The weekly ISRF Section and Club results were displayed on the internet.

The members and birds competing in each section was put on the section diplomas on a weekly bases where possible,

The system of texting the full members every week was continued this year with 25,000 approx texts sent out in 2018 informing the members when the birds were out and other information. As far as i know most fanciers are still happy with the texts.

PROVISIONAL WEEKLY RESULT

The top 6 of each club result in the ISRF competing in the ISRF Open Races was texted to the fed secretary on the day of the **Open Races** and as a result a more accurate result of **the top 50** was texted to the each club secretary on the day of the each Open ISRF race. Some clubs don't comply with this fed rule and as a result an accurate top 50 cannot be compiled.

The open races were completed with pools most weeks and a hard copy was also given out at the transporters on a weekly basis provided there were no problems with the result.

The ISRF committee meetings were kept to minimum, this year

I helped the Treasure to present a breakdown of the open races and the balance sheet this year. The ISRF balance sheet shows the ISRF has balance this year with **37,000** in the bank.

Prize money is approx. **35000 euro a year and the ISRF** is the only fed that gives such prize money.

9 LIBERATOR'S REPORT

Good year and good returns the French race had a fairly good result, he felt a new liberator should be elected if possible.

EF The books were presented well by the treasurer 100% and he felt the ISRF had one of the best treasurers in the country. The balance sheet shows a loss in income of 9000 and an increase in expenditure of 50000 so the biggest problem is the loss in members over the least 5 years.

The ISRF has the biggest prize money in Europe he felt. Sickness has a major impact on the birdage also. Maintains of the trucks is an ongoing cost. Other organisations had lost thousands in 2018 also due to sickness.

The chairman said motions 23,24,25 will be dealt with now.

There was two documentaries on pigeons coming out produced by RTE. **This is me**, (nearly finished) and **the Secret life of pigeons**. (Proposed) .

A pigeon auction would be a good idea for charities' and have it well published. People in their 30s he felt may take up the sport of pigeon racing. A committee of a few members with a few ideas would be a start to promote the sport and educate the general public regarding the pigeon racing.

A campaign to raise awareness regarding the pigeon sport and show how keeping pigeons can help the mental health of people.

The chairman agreed with most of the points the PRO made and felt the auction for the purpose of promoting the sport would not be a problem.

12 BALANCE SHEET

The chairman pointed out the breakdown of the open races and the negative balance he races were incurring.

Channel races were not being supported. An increase of 15 euro in the ISRF fee was needed rather that increasing the birdage. The lack of Y Birds in the last YB races is affecting the income of the ISRF also.

Expenditure in up this year and income is down. Drug testing became very expense as a blanket approach. Questions were asked regarding the balance sheet 9000 on transporters and the cleaning of the transporters.

Some small repairs are still needed going forward.

- 1. The race program will be for the next 5 years if possible. Chairman Passed.
- 2. 15 For Open Channel Races

All birds timed on race day from the channel to be notified (by text) within 1 hour to the club secretary. Not passed

All clocks on the channel races to be returned to clubs for 7 pm.

No clocks accepted after 7 pm.

No clocks to be printed before 7 pm.

Birds clocked after 6pm to be returned to the club at 7pm the following evening. Passed

For Open Inland Races.

All clocks to be returned to clubs for 5pm or within 2 hours if clocking later than 3 pm (Saturday & Sunday).

No clocks to be printed before 5pm.

Stations open for 1 hour.

For weekday open races (Monday to Friday) all clocks to be returned to stations for 7pm or within 2 hours if clocking later than 5 pm.

3. Channel open races is a 3 day race.

The French channel race is a 4 day race.

GENERAL RACE RULES

6. To encourage small team fanciers to send to open races

On a trial bases it is proposed to introduce a European points system (loft performance) for open races.

500 euro sponsorship by Pigeonlink. Plus 500 euro from the ISRF. 1000 euro divided between the first 3 lofts ,500,300,200 euro.

Birds must be carded in the first ISRF 100 positions.

Points per bird for each race = bird limit/birds sent = points per bird

Eg 50/25 birds sent = 2 points per bird.

Total points for each fancier is added up each week and added to a weekly league of points.

Pigeonlink will supply a weekly running average for this league.
